

# How To Make a Sand Seal

If you go to a beach or play in a sand pit, why not try making a seal out of sand? In winter, perhaps you could even try making a seal out of snow. Here's how...

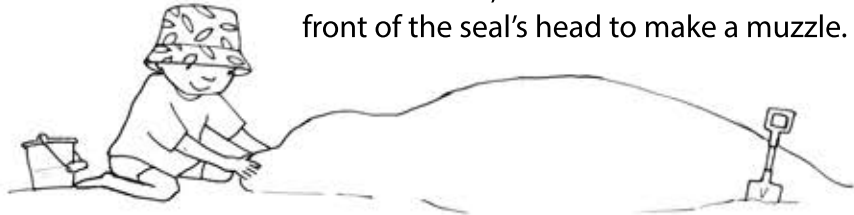
# Noah's Seal



1. Build a longish mound for the seal's body, with a smaller mound at one end for the head.



5. Smooth everything into shape and draw fingers and toes at the end of each flipper. (Seals normally have five on each limb, just like we do.)



2. Build another, even smaller mound on the front of the seal's head to make a muzzle.

6. Now you're ready to decorate your seal. Look for:

*(If you're not by the sea, find grasses, twigs, leaves and stones to make the seal's features.)*

- spiky dune grass for whiskers,



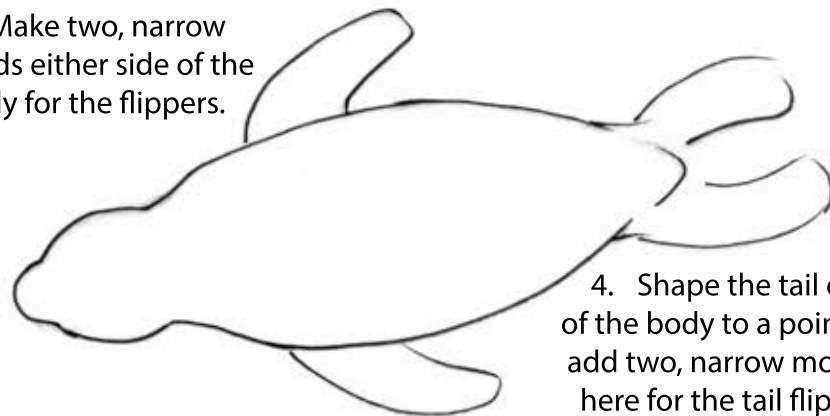
- two shiny pebbles for eyes

- shells for a speckled back,

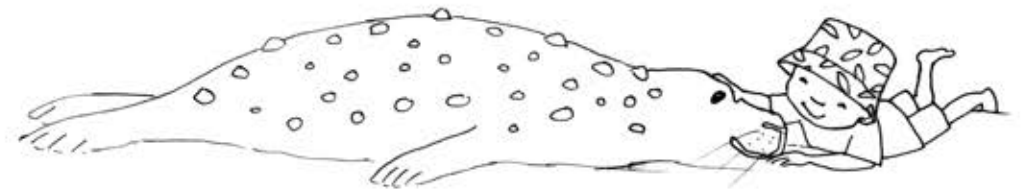
- a piece of seaweed for a mouth.

3. Make two, narrow mounds either side of the body for the flippers.

With all these features in place, your seal is ready!



4. Shape the tail end of the body to a point and add two, narrow mounds here for the tail flippers.
